"If you do not transform your pain, you will with 100% certainty transmit it...
To use a metaphor, most people are like electric wires: what comes in is what goes out. Someone calls you a name, and

you called him a name back; that is most people pass on the same energy that is given to them. Now compare an electric wire to those big ugly gray transformers that you see on telephone poles. Dangerous current or voltage comes in, but something happens inside that gray box and what comes out is, in fact, now helpful and productive. When you see transformers on the telephone pole from now on, think of Jesus. That is what he did: he hung on the cross and the energy that came toward him, he did not return in kind. He held it inside, and made it into something much better that would now pass through history."

As you have read in the reflection from Richard Rohr above, followers of Christ, have an example of what a transformed and transforming life can look like. I want to become a Christian that can take in negative energy and produce fruitful and loving energy. By God's grace and our willingness, this is possible.

You will see a transformer placed near my office at the church, with some handouts that I hope people will pick up and read. These are written for our church members as well as the hundreds of people who come in and out of our church building each week. As we go through massive cultural, political and ecclesiastical tensions, shifts and debates, there will be ample opportunity and need to become transformed Christians, who can transform energies of hate and fear, into responses of love and compassion.

May God help us to become transformed and transforming people.

Dear Friends,

As we continue to pray and discern how God wants us to live out our prayer "Make us one with Christ, one with each other, and one in ministry to all the world," I came across the following in my daily devotional reading and felt led to share it with you.

"Jesus' command of love is tough. People throughout the ages have tried to make it work. Some people have died for it; almost all have known the discouragement of failing to make it work. What does this love demand? Of all the attempts to bring some insight into what love demands, I have found those which explore the notion of "hospitality" to be the most helpful. The New Testament word for this kind of love which is commanded, and which is the love that reconciles, is agape. The Greek word, however, does not seem to work for most people today. Who knows what it means? "Hospitality" works. Everyone seems to have some idea of what it means."






