


elements of worship, scanning the hymnal, and reviewing the lectionary texts for Pentecost they were set to create a unique worship experience.


Community is so important to the Chatham UMC. The small groups that have met together for decades, or more recently, grow in their love for one another, and with the One whom they serve together.

Dear Friends,

This month marks a major milestone in my path of ministry. On Sunday evening, May 22, in Wildwood New Jersey as part of this year's Annual Conference session I will be ordained as a deacon in the Greater New Jersey Annual Conference of the United Methodist Church! Our Book of Discipline explains it this way: "Within the church community there are persons whose gifts, evidence of God's grace, and promise of future usefulness are affirmed by the community, and who respond to God's call by offering themselves in leadership as set-apart ordained ministers ... Ordination to this ministry is a gift from God to the church. In ordination, the church affirms and continues the [apostle's] ministry through persons empowered by the Holy Spirit." (more on the Holy Spirit a little later)

Ordination represents the culmination of a very long journey for me, and I'm delighted, humbled, and grateful to God for this moment. It's particularly meaningful for me to be ordained while serving the Chatham United Methodist Church. I first served here in 1997 as a Drew seminarian – the very first congregation I served in a pastoral role. I thank you for your prayers, support, and partnership in our ongoing work of service to God and God's people, and I look forward to more ministry together. In the words of the apostle Paul, "I thank my God every time I remember you, constantly praying with joy in every one of my prayers for all of you, because of your sharing in the gospel from the first day until now. I am confident of this, that the one who began a good work among you will bring it to completion by the day of Jesus Christ." (Philippians 1:3-6, NRSV)

Also in May, on the 15th, we conclude the Great Fifty Days of the Easter Season (we need fifty days to celebrate Jesus' awesome, amazing resurrection!) with the celebration of Pentecost Sunday. On Pentecost we recognize and give thanks for God's gift to the church of the Holy Spirit. The color for the day is red, to remind us of the tongues of flame present on Pentecost as told in Acts chapter 2. Symbols of Pentecost include:

- Dove (Peace) at Jesus' baptism, "just as he was coming out of the water, he saw the heavens torn apart and the Spirit descending like a dove on him." (Mark 1:10)
- Wind (Power) "And suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting." (Acts 2:2)
- Fire (Passion) "Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of them." (Acts 2:3)

May the Peace, Power, and Passion of the Holy Spirit be real in our lives - today, tomorrow, and always!


