Dear Friends,

This past June marked the fifth anniversary of the death of my mother, Louise Capron. My mom was the daughter of a Methodist pastor, a lifelong faithful United Methodist, and lived to the "ripe old age" of 94. I credit her with much of my own life of faith. I was going through some things recently from the time around her death, and was reminded of a significant incident.

My first day back in my office at the Succasunna United Methodist Church after my mom's death, I was working my way through the backlog of items on my desk. One of our booklets of Sunday School curriculum literally fell open to the page containing the following words:

"Imagine three concentric circles, with Jesus as the center one. In the first circle around him are his immediate friends, gathered for the last supper. The next circle may look familiar – it is composed of followers like us who lived after Jesus' death. In today's gospel [John 17:20-26], Jesus tells of a mystery: the outer circle can be just as close as the inner one. Jesus prays that those whose faith is based on the word of the first disciples can be one with the whole body of believers. As we enter this mystery, we may remember the traditional teaching that sometimes our loved ones are closer to us after they have died than before. Their lives on earth may have been marked by various pressures on the relationship they had with us: personality conflicts, financial problems, job stresses, addictions to alcohol or drugs. Even the most loving relationship can be strained by lack of time or proximity. After death, they can look after us without interruption, love us without distraction."

These words were a source of great comfort in the midst of my grief. I'm not exactly sure why I feel led to share them in this month's Circuit Rider, but I trust that God has something in mind. I offer these words to all who have lost loved ones - recently, or long ago - in the hope and prayer that they may be of comfort to you as well.




